<u>Launch of SLQS Gallery Screening Room/Relation de Voyage/If you jump on a moving</u> tram, where do you land? Ronnie Danaher

SLQS Gallery Screening Room is a curation of films by International artists. Each screening is available online for a limited time only with an exclusive artwork by the artist.

Launching on 8 March 2024, SLQS Gallery Screening Room premieres with <u>Relation de Voyage</u>, a curation of artist films exploring the essence of journeying and transcending conventional perceptions of reality. Featuring works by international contemporary artists, the Screening Room invites audiences to delve into narratives that redefine borders, challenge colonialist legacies, and offer new perspectives on space, corporeality, and existence.

Relation de Voyage opens with <u>If you jump on a moving tram, where do you land? (2024) by Ronnie Danaher</u>. Shot during a residency at Fabbrica del Vapore in Milan, this single-channel HD video explores the liminal space between past and present, inspired by the idea of purgatory as a journey and glitch as a queer form of refusal.

"I see this glitch, this refusal to perform, this "fantastic failure" as a kind of ritual space where the minutiae of everyday scrolling might transcend into the sacred."

Ronnie Danaher is an artist and filmmaker based in Leeds, UK. Her multidisciplinary practice combines moving image, digital technology, and sculptural installation to examine the intersections between the sacred and the digital world. This work investigates themes of the sacred, liminality, screen time, guilt and shame, investigating a reflection on digital culture and belief systems.
